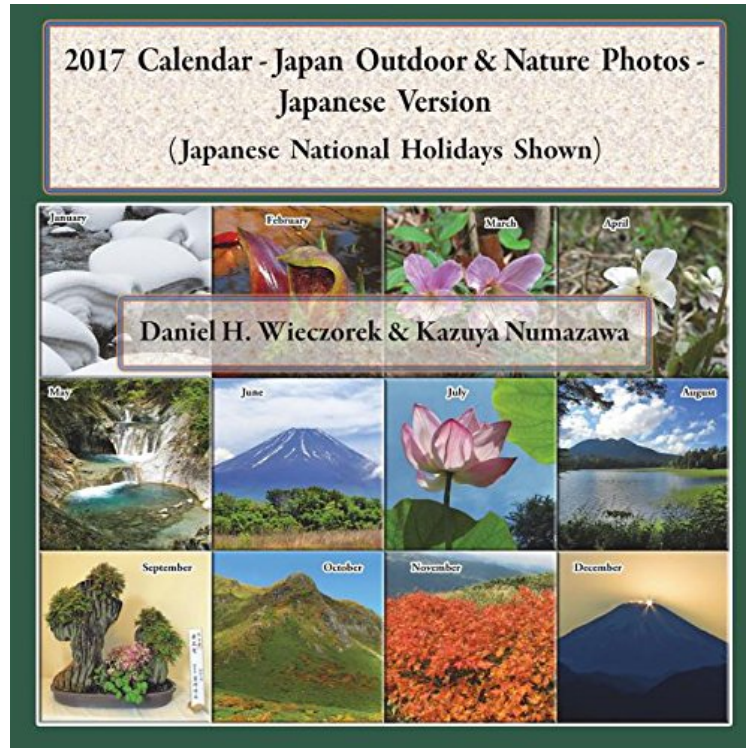

February: An amazing Skunk Cabbage (*Symplocarpus foetidus*) blossom in Nogawa Park, Mitaka, Tokyo, Japan. March: Two *Viola eizanensis* flowers near Mt. Takao, Tokyo, Japan. April: A Takao Violet (*Viola yezoensis* f. *discolor*) blossom near Mt. Takao, Tokyo, Japan. May: Nishizawa (West Creek) and waterfalls, Yamanashi Prefecture, Japan. June: Mt.
