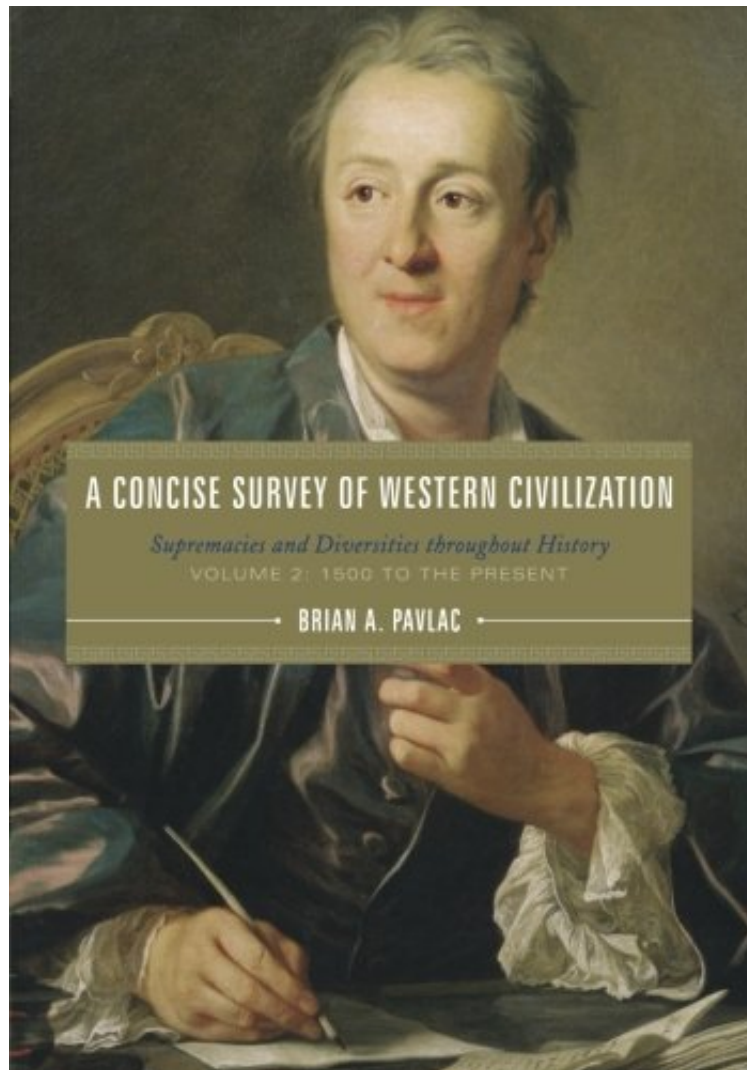


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## **A Concise Survey of Western Civilization: Supremacies and Diversities throughout History, Vol. 2: 1500 to the Present (Volume 2: 1500)**
