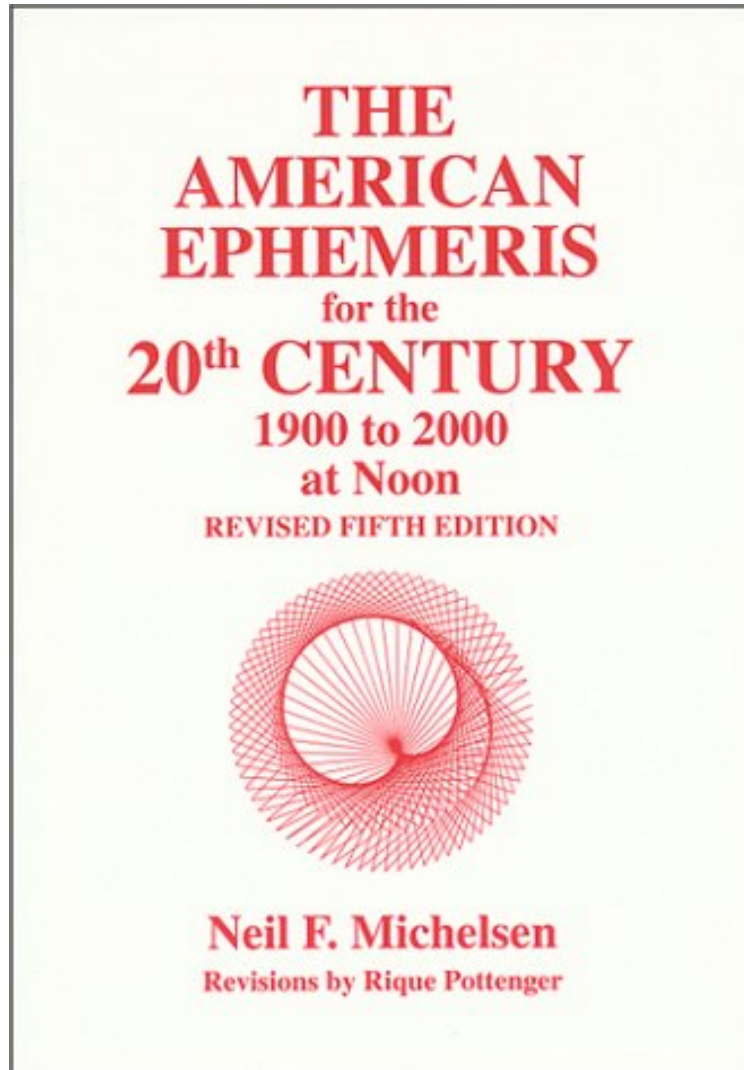

The only thing I've noticed it is missing is declinations. If you are buying this book you probably already know what you are doing and you know this will serve your needs. I also have the noon ephemeris but this one is better for taking the NCGR-PAA certification tests. The tests are based on the midnight ephemeris, especially level two. I got through level one with the noon ephemeris but I had to do some extra calculations to convert the data to the midnight numbers.
