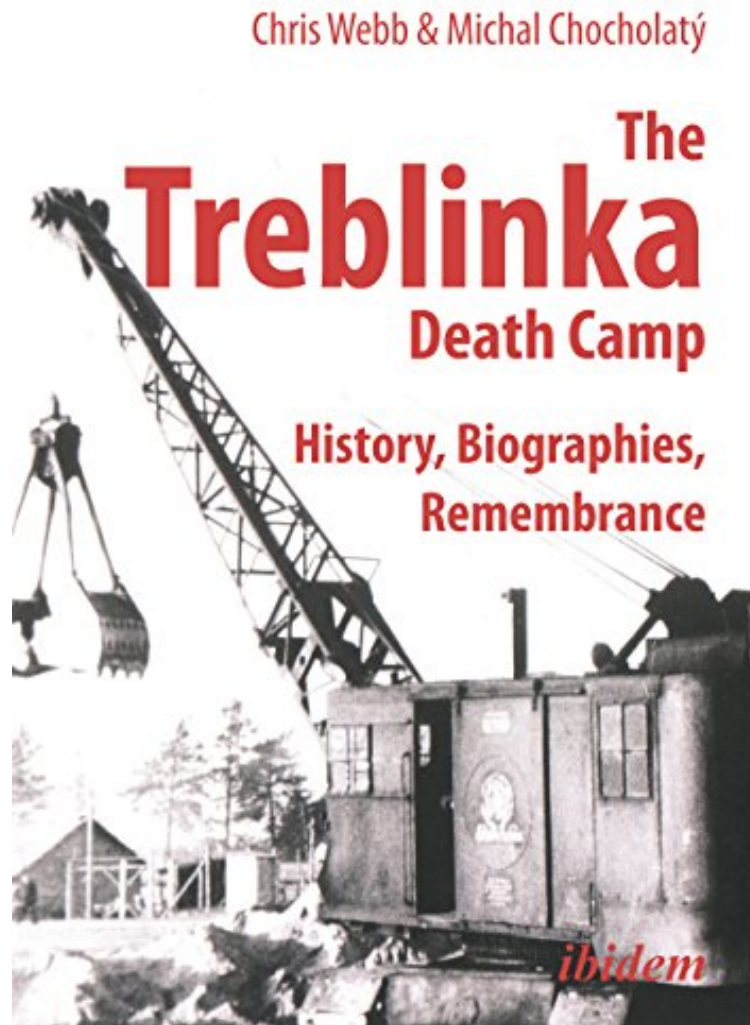

The book describes the testimonies of survivors, of which at this moment (the 29th of July 2015) only Samuel Willenberg is still alive as the last survivor of the revolt on August 2, 1943.
