Malcolm launched EMILY's List, a powerhouse political organization that seeks to ignite change by getting women elected to office. The rest is riveting history: Between 1986 when there were only 12 Democratic women in the House and none in the Senate and now, EMILY's List has helped elect 19 women Senators, 11 governors, and 110 Democratic women to the House.
